APPLICATION

- 1. This is an application for judicial review of the May 22, 2020 decision of the Respondent Minister of Transport to accept the Minimum Safe Manning (MSM) level submitted by the Respondent BC Ferry Services Inc (BC Ferries) Island Class vessels at five crew for up to 145 passengers.
- Pursuant to the Minister's decision under s. 202(3)((b) of the Marine Personnel Regulations (SOR/2007-115) (MPR), of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 (S.C. 2001, c. 26), the Minister's delegate issued MSM Documents on May 22, 2020 for the M.V. Island Aurora and the M.V. Island Discovery.
- 3. The Applicant BC Ferry and Marine Workers' Union (BCFMWU) is the certified bargaining agent for BC Ferries employees including seafarers and officers operating the *MV Island Aurora* and *MV Island Discovery* who are directly impacted by the MSM levels for the vessel.
- 4. The Respondent BC Ferry Corporation took possession of the *MV Island Aurora* and *MV Island Discovery* in or about February 2020 and have a capacity of 300 passengers and crew.
- 5. These two new Island Class vessels replaced the *North Island Princess* which regularly sailed with a minimum complement of seven crew and the *Quadra Queen II*, which regularly sailed with a minimum complement of six crew on their respective runs on June 8, 2020.
- 6. BC Ferries applied to Transport Canada for an MSM level of five crew on or about March 8, 2020.
- 7. The Minister of Transport delegated his authority to Transport Canada's National Safer Manning Team and Marine Safety Inspector(s) (the Minister's Delegate).
- 8. The MSM application was made without notice to the BCFMWU and the MSM was set by the Minister's Delegate without providing any notice to the BCFMWU of the application or process.

- 9. The Island Class MSM was set pursuant to a revised application process in which the authorized representative of a vessel proposes the MSM to Transport Canada rather than the Minister's Delegate setting the MSM through an empirical process.
- 10. BCFMWU has a real and substantial interest in the MSM levels for the Island Class Vessels and the process used by the Minister's Delegate.
- 11. The Minister's Delegate is required by the *MPR* to issue MSM which allow the crew to meet all the requirements of Canadian regulations and meet the requirements of the international instructions such as the International Maritime Organization.
- 12. The Island Class vessel cannot meet the requirements of the *MPR* with a crew of five.
- 13. The Island Class vessel cannot meet the requirements of the *Fire and Boat Drills Regulations* (SOR/2010-83), with a crew of five.
- 14. The Island Class vessels cannot meet several of the BC Ferries Fleet and Vessel Safety Operations Policies including bridge watch, passenger control, rescue operations, and fire fighting with a crew of five.
- 15. BC Ferries cannot meet the requirements of the *Safety Management Regulations* (SOR/98-348).

THE APPLICANT MAKES APPLICATION FOR:

- 1. An order in the nature of certiorari that the MSM Documents issued to the *M.V. Island Aurora* and the *M.V. Island Discovery* be quashed.
- 2. An order that the BC Ferries Island Class Vessels operate with an MSM of seven crew for up to 145 passengers until such time as the Minister sets a new MSM.
- 3. Costs of the Application.
- 4. Such other relief as the court deems just.

THE GROUNDS FOR THE APPLICATION ARE:

- 1. The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in accepting an MSM level for the Island Class vessels which do not meet the requirements of the Marine Personnel Regulations.
- 2. The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in accepting an MSM level for the Island Class vessels which do not meet the requirements of the *Fire and Boat Drills Regulations*
- 3. The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in accepting an MSM level for the Island Class vessels which are in breach of the *Safety Management Regulations*.
- 4. The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in accepting a MSM level for the Island Class vessels which did not meet the standards of IMO Resolution A.1047(27) Adopted on 30 November 2011 PRINCIPLES OF MINIMUM SAFE MANNING.
- The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in failing to follow a process to set the MSM level for the Island Class vessel which met the standards of IMO Resolution A.1047(27) Adopted on 30 November 2011 PRINCIPLES OF MINIMUM SAFE MANNING.
- The Minister's Delegate improperly fettered their discretion and made an unreasonable decision by accepting BC Ferries proposed MSM level for the Island Class vessels which violated its own fleet and vessel safety policies.
- 7. The Minister's delegate improperly fettered their discretion and made an unreasonable decision in accepting an MSM level for the Island Class vessels without obtaining any information from the crew of the vessels or their representative the BCFMWU about the implementation of the MSM levels.

8. The Minister's Delegate erred in law and made an unreasonable decision in failing to make the primary consideration in accepting an MSM level for the Island Class vessels the safety and interest of the travelling public.
