**RE: FAIR FERRY FUNDING** 

British Columbians rely on our ferry system the way others rely on roads and bridges. It's essential public infrastructure. When ferry fares rise or sailings are cut, it's workers, families, and small businesses that pay the price.

We appreciate that your government stepped in with \$500 million to help cap fare increases. But the fact remains: BC continues to do the heavy lifting while the federal government underfunds marine transportation—especially compared to Atlantic Canada.

The federal government has pledged more than \$125 million in new support for ferry operations in Eastern Canada and has promised to cut fares by half on multiple routes. Meanwhile, BC Ferries received no mention in the 2024 federal budget, and the \$75 million loan issued in 2023 remains just that—a loan.

When asked about this discrepancy on the campaign trail, Prime Minister Carney said that he's open to working with the province. That's not good enough. Ferry-dependent communities in BC deserve equitable treatment.

We're asking you to stand up with us and call on the federal government to establish permanent, equitable ferry funding indexed to inflation and ridership and invest in Canadian shipbuilding and good union jobs.

As Premier Eby has said affordable ferry service is essential for BC's economy and quality of life. With a new federal government in place, we believe this is a key moment to press for lasting change.
